- ⇒ those who wish to help others in specific community and workplace settings and desire to learn more about pastoral care in outreach and mission
- ⇒ those who desire to explore a call to pastoral care

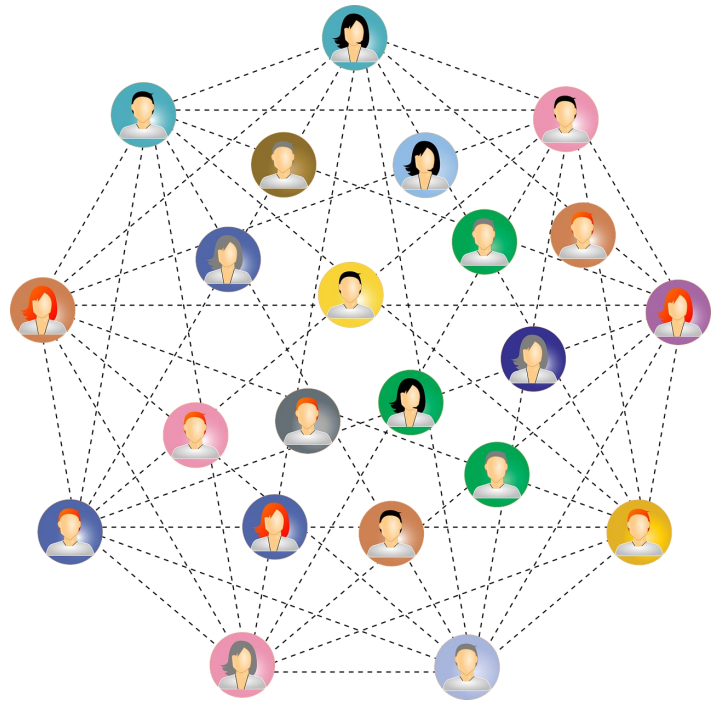
